Our April speaker was **Shirley Jones** from the **American Crime Prevention Institute**. She started her talk by asking us to try to identify the five top personal crimes in the US. Any idea? They were

- 1)Purse Snatching
- 2)Assault
- 3)Robbery
- 4)Sex crimes and
- 5)Car Jacking.

Any surprises? I know it surprised a lot of us as none of us were able to guess purse snatching was the number one personal crime and that it is generally much more violent than we had imagined.
