I appreciated the opportunity I and the other BAYMEC members had to meet with you for breakfast at Pete's Harbor on April 10, and at that time you expressed some strong concerns about how the insurance industry could best come to terms with the AIDS crisis without undermining either actuarial principles or human rights.

In the past two weeks, I have attempted to locate some papers on this subject, and am enclosing three for your information and consideration as you and the California Legislature address this extremely serious issue:
